Opposing Labour's Council Tax Rise

Gateshead residents facing another potential council tax rise



Your Lib Dem councillors Peter Maughan and Vicky Anderson are opposed to Labour's council tax rise.

As we write this edition of FOCUS the Labour-run council has still not confirmed their planned council tax hike but they've failed to rule out the max 4.99%.

Vicky said "Gateshead residents already have to pay the highest council tax of any similar council in England. No other local council charges over £1,800 for a Band D property."

"Residents deserve a break, especially at a time of mounting job losses and pay freezes because of the Covid-19 pandemic."

"Other councils in Tyne and Wear don't tax residents anywhere near as much, while much larger councils in

Liverpool and Manchester also charge less. It's about time residents were given some breathing space while household budgets are so tight."

Still no plans for Dunston school



The old Dunston school continues to stand derelict despite standing empty since 2009.

Cllr Peter Maughan said, "I share the frustration of the residents of Dunston that the Council has allowed the empty building to stand empty and deteriorating despite my interventions with senior officers. House building seems to be the only viable alternative as the Council has already decided to demolish the school; however I would welcome alternative viable suggestions."

Former Dunston Hill Hospital

Plans have been submitted to redevelop the land on the site of the former Dunston Hill Hospital. The hospital, which had been providing palliative care and mental health services for more than 50 years, closed it's doors for the last time in 2018. The plans submitted to Gateshead Council include seeking permission to build up to 46 homes on the site. The council is expected to decide on the proposals some time this year.

Register to vote by post

At the time of writing this FOCUS, it is currently proposed that the May local elections are going ahead as planned. "Voting by post is a safe way to make sure your voice is still heard in the upcoming local elections," said **Cllr Vicky Anderson**.

Bring back free TV licenses for over 75s

From August 2020, the Government has cut funding for free TV licenses for the over 75s. Your local Lib Dem councillors are campaigning to get the government to bring the free TV licenses for over 75s back.

Cllr Peter Maughan said "During COVID-19, television has been a lifeline. It is shameful that some older people could lose out. That's why I'm calling on the Government to bring back the free TV licenses for over 75s."

Save Free TV Licences

Letters from TV licensing have started going out. You don't have to do anything until TV licensing contact you. You may still be eligible for a free TV license if you are over 75 and are in receipt of pension credit. To find out more, if you think you are eligible for a free TV license or if you have queries about how to claim pension credit, you can call TV licensing on 0300 790 6117.
