


Council rejects safety crossing outside school

Gateshead Council has rejected calls from local residents for a safety crossing outside Oakfield Infant and Junior School on Chowdene Bank.

Late last year local Councillor **Daniel Duggan** and concerned parents met with the Council's traffic engineers to discuss how to improve safety outside Oakfield. After carrying out a traffic survey, the Council officers have concluded that "the level of pedestrians at Chowdene Bank is not high enough to justify a controlled pedestrian crossing".

Daniel said "Road safety is so important. We know that a pupil was knocked over in November and people are concerned that more accidents may occur, especially at school opening and closing times. Although there is a school crossing patrol officer outside Oakfield once again, residents and parents have told us of their disappointment that the Council won't be installing a safety crossing. There is some good news because Council officers will be starting road safety campaigns this month and will be meeting with the police to discuss other options to improve safety. We will be monitoring this issue closely".

Bus Tax Approved

News in brief

Trees to be pruned in Kells Lane Park

After residents from **Robinswood** got in touch to tell us that branches from the trees in Kells Lane park were hitting their windows we have arranged for council officers to trim them back.

Garden waste bin

Unfortunately, the garden waste collection ends in October, but we are continuing to press the Council to extend it until November as we know many people still have leaves in their garden at that point in the year.

Speeding on Saltwell Road South

Council Officers have told us that they are preparing a list of new 20mph zones and that this could include parts of **Saltwell Road South** where excessive speeding has been recorded. This work should have been undertaken months ago and the Low Fell Councillors are continuing to raise the issue.

Noise on Clement Street

Following a legal notice from the Council, British Telecom have said that they will undertake work to reduce the noise disturbance to neighbours. Council Officers have worked hard on behalf of residents to resolve the issue and we have thanked them.

Council reserves grow as Labour plans hike in Council Tax

Gateshead Council will be setting their budget for the year ahead next month and there is concern that another Council Tax hike is planned.

This is despite news that the Council has been building up huge reserves. Lib Dem Councillors – who are the only opposition to Labour on the Council – have discovered that Labour bosses have been building up vast reserves. Reserves now stand at £39 million.

Labour-run Gateshead Council already charges the highest level of Council Tax of any metropolitan borough in the country.

Ron Beadle, Deputy Leader of the Lib Dem Opposition, said "Labour are planning to hit Council Taxpayers again whilst building huge

levels of reserves. It is right to plan ahead, but Council taxpayers deserve a break. Piling up huge sums of money in the bank while local residents struggle to pay their Council Tax and public services are cut just isn't right".

Councillor **Daniel Duggan** said "Many people are really feeling the burden of year on year increases in Council Tax and Labour bosses at the Civic Centre need to realise this".
