Fears that Council Tax will be increased again!

There are fears that Labour-run Gateshead Council is planning to hit residents with another Council Tax rise.

Gateshead Council will be setting their budget in late February.
Gateshead Council already charges the highest Council Tax of any metropolitan Council in England.

Local campaigner Amanda Wintcher said "Many residents are really feeling the rise in the cost of living at the moment. Another hike

Council Tax will only make this worse. Lib Dem Councillors will be looking at the proposed budget very carefully and will be calling on Gateshead Labour bosses to give residents a break".



Council promises that local libraries will remain open



The Council's decision to carry out a review of library services in Gateshead has sparked concern amongst many residents. Residents have contacted the Focus Team with concerns over whether Pelaw Library and Leam Library will be closed as a result of the review.

lan Patterson and Paul Diston have raised this

matter with Council officers and have been assured that neither Pelaw Library or Leam Library will be closed.

Paul Diston said "Our libraries are a lifeline for many people. Closing them would be completely unacceptable. We will be monitoring this situation very carefully and holding the Council to their word".

The consultation for the library review has now closed and as soon as we know the results, and what the Council plans to do, we will let residents know.

£1 million in traffic fines!

The Council has now received over £1 million from drivers fined for using the new bus lane on Askew Road. Local campaigner Amanda Wintcher met Lib Dem MP, Tim Farron, on his recent visit to Gateshead and told him that residents have complained that the fines are unfair because of inadequate signage.

Amanda said "Forcing drivers to turn right when they are trying to get to Newcastle actually worsens pollution in the town centre and adds to congestion. The Labour-run Council may be making a lot of money from this but at what cost to the environment and health?"

Focus Team demand action on potholes

Harrison Close almost complete



The new build of **Harrison Close** is now largely complete.

As the development is technically outside of the 20mph zone in Bill Quay, lan has contacted the Developer to get the paperwork required to the Council.

Increased vehicle activity in **Gullane Close** has led to a deterioration in the state of the roads and kerbs. Ian has told the Council about this and and asked them to make improvements.

Anger as Labour -run Gateshead Council increases rent

In January, Gateshead Labour Councillors voted to increase the rent for Gateshead Council tenants by 4.1%. Liberal Democrat Councillors, including Ian Patterson and Paul Diston, opposed this.

Paul Diston said "This increase will be a big blow to residents. Many people are really feeling the cost of living crisis and this increase will only make things worse for many people. This is more money out of people's pockets and more into the Council's coffers". The rise will be introduced in April.
