Crime in Low Fell: The Facts

Working for a safer Low Fell: Focus Team raise issue of crime with police

There is a lot of concern about crime in Low Fell at the moment and we have raised this with the police. Here are the figures for reported crime in the Low Fell ward. These show the categories of crime that people have asked us about most often. They compare this summer and last summer:

The only significant increase is in vehicle crime. We have spoken with Inspector Robson who runs the South Area Command. He has told us that "94% of theft from vehicles is from unlocked cars". At a meeting with Low Fell Councillors and residents in October, officers urged residents to always report crime, including anti-social behaviour, and to make sure that vehicles are kept locked. Lib Dems say "Axe the Bus Tax!"



Local Lib Dems are fighting Labour's proposed bus tax

Plans by Labour to slap a £50-a-day charge on buses using central Newcastle could result in fewer services in Gateshead, more cars on local roads, higher fares, more congestion and more pollution.

The bus tax is part of revised plans put forward by Labourrun Newcastle, Gateshead and North Tyneside Councils after initial proposals earlier this year to charge nearly every vehicle to drive across bridges over the Tyne to tackle air pollution were widely slammed as unworkable.

The new plans include charging older buses £50 a day to drive in central Newcastle, though it would not apply to new, clean buses. Lorries and vans will also have to pay. Charging cars to enter central Newcastle is not proposed yet, but there will be an option to do so in the future.

Ron Beadle said "The proposal to charge buses could lead to fewer services for residents. Labour say they want more people using buses, but this will have the opposite effect. Please sign our petition below to axe the bus tax".

The Focus Team are continuing to get graffiti removed in Low Fell, including on BT, Virgin Media, and Council property and are calling for a more proactive approach to graffiti removal from the Council.

Daniel Duggan, who reported the graffiti pictured below on **Beacon Lough Road**, said "We recently met with the Leader of the Council and senior Council officers and discussed graffiti. Currently, offenders who are undertaking community payback do not clean graffiti as Gateshead Council's community payback team is contracted out. This is wrong. We are calling for community payback to be brought in-house so offenders can clean up graffiti and, hopefully, we will see less of it".
