Earlier this year, Liberal Democrats in Gateshead exposed over £1.5 million of Labour waste at Gateshead Council. Notorious examples include:

- £400,000 on play equipment in the Chandless Estate and Clasper Village which were demolished shortly afterwards.
- £1 million on Civic Centre refurbishment.
- £2,300 to send Labour Council Leader Martin Gannon on an expenses-paid trip to the French Riviera to attend a property developers' get-together.
- £5,000 on meals over a 3 year period for the Labour Leader.
- £31,000 on repairs to out-of-date equipment at Birtley Crematorium shortly before Labour agreed to scrap the old cremator and install a new one.
- £140,000 on a pedestrian crossing in Whickham which is only 20 metres from another crossing!

But there is more bad news: Labour waste in Gateshead and across the North East has continued to grow. Here are some new additions to Labour's list of waste shame:



A £620 meal for two, at your expense, at the upmarket Grosvenor Hotel in London (plus a further £330 travel expenses).



A £750,000 car park that hardly anyone uses. The Council even forgot to get planning permission for it!



Labour's Police and Crime Commissioner resigned for a better job. The by-election cost £2.5 million (enough for 100 police officers!).

But there is also good news. In 2018, Lib Dems exposed figures showing Martin Gannon (pictured), Labour leader of Gateshead Council, had claimed £5,000 in meal allowances over a three year period.

Following the storm of protest and bad publicity generated by Cllr Gannon's claims, he has stopped claiming for his meals!

"That's a big saving to taxpayers!" said Lib Dem Councillor **John McClurey**.
